Georgia guidestones list

He then borrowed the price several times more than the real one, but again Christian seemed indifferent, so Fendley sent him to Wyatt Martin, president of Granite City Bank. Martin is probably one of those who's seen the mystery man and talked to him the most. Ten guides, clock, calendar and compass Astrological specifications were incredibly complex, so the construction company had to hire the help of an astronomer at the University of Georgia. The complex shows, among other things, the day of the year, the ethics and solstices. But the main feature is 10 guides carved in several languages. The structure is engraved with 10 instructions in eight modern languages and a shorter message is engraved on the top of the structure with four manuscripts of the ancient language. The monument is located about 230 meters above sea level, about 140 kilometers east of Atlanta, 72 kilometers north of Athens, Georgia and 14 kilometers north of elberton city center. In the center stands one sna, around which four are arranged. With five astronomically aligned stays on top of 15 tiles, there's a cap stone. The extra stone tablet, set on the ground a short distance west of the structure, offers some notes on the history and purpose of the guide stones. The structure is sometimes called american Stonehenge. [1] The monument is 5.87 metres high and is made of six granite slabs weighing 237,746 pounds (107,840 kg). [2] The anonymity of the authors of the guide stones and their apparent defence of population management, eudation and internationalism have made them the object of controversy and conspiracy theory. History In June 1979, a man who used the pseudonym R.C. Christian approached elberton Granite Finishing Company on behalf of a small group of loyal Americans and ordered Christian explained that: act as a compass, calendar and clock, and should be able to withstand catastrophic events. Joe Fendley of Elberton Granite assumed christian was crazy and tried to discourage him by offering an offer of a fee that was several times larger than any project the company had previously taken, explaining that the guidelines would require additional tools and consultants. [2] In arranging the payment, Christian said he represented a group that had been designing the guidelines stones for 20 years and who wished to remain anonymous. [2] Christian provided a scale model of the guide stones and 10 pages of specifications. [2] Christian bought the 5 hectares (2 hectares) of land apparently on 1 January 2007. [2] Mullinex and his children were given lifetime cattle grazing rights in the area of the guide stones. [2] 22. The memorial was unveiled in front of an audience of 100[5] or 400 people in different ways. [2] Christian later transferred the land and the guidelines to Elbert County. [2] Stones are defaced with polyurethane paint and graffiti. In 2008, the stones were defaced with polyurethane paint and graffiti slogans such as Death to the New World Order. Wired magazine called the deprabbing the first serious act of vandalism in the history of guide stones. [2] In September 2014, an Elbert County Maintenance Department employee contacted the FEDERAL Bureau of Investigation after rocks were vandalized with graffiti, including the phrase I am Isis, the goddess of love. [7] Description The markings on georgia's guidelines are engraved with a message consisting of 10 sets of instructions or principles[8] in eight different languages, in one language on each face of the four large vertical stones. Moving clockwise around the structure from the north, these languages are: English, Spanish, Swahili, Hindi, Hebrew, Arabic, Traditional Chinese and Russian. Explanatory tablet The explanatory tablet is placed next to the stones A few meters to the west of the monument is set with an additional granite book set at ground level. This tablet recognizes the structure and the languages used in it list different facts about the size, weight and astronomical properties of the stones, the installation date and project sponsors. It also refers to a time capsule buried under the tablet, but the empty spaces of the stone, intended to meet the dates when the capsule was buried and opened, are not engraved, so it is uncertain whether the time capsule has ever actually been deployed. The full text of the explanatory tablet is given below. The tablet is slightly inconsistent with punctuation and the misspelled word pseudonym. The original spelling, spans, and line breaks of the text are preserved in the following transcription (case not). At the top of the tablet is written: The Georgia Guidestones Center cluster erected on March 22, 1980 Just below this are square outlines with written inside: Let these be an era of reason Around the edges of the Square written translations into four ancient languages, one per border. Starting from above and advancing clockwise, they are: Babylonian (in

cuneiform script), classic Greek, Sanskrit and ancient Egyptian (in hieroglyphs). [9] The centre column has holes drilled at an angle from side to side through which you can see the North Star, a star whose position changes over time only very gradually. The same pillar has an opening carved through it that aligns with the sun's day stopper and ethic. The 78in (22 mm) opening in the cap allows the sun's ray to pass every day at noon, shining a ray on the mid-wing indicating the day of the year. [2] Interpretations Yoko Ono said the engraved messages are a confusing call for rational thinking, while Wired noted that unspecified adversaries have labeled them the Ten Commandments of the Antichrist. [2] The guidelines have become an object of interest to conspiracy theorists. One of them, an activist named Mark Dice, called for the guide stones to be smashed into a million pieces, and then the ruins used for the construction project,[10], arguing that the guide stones are of deep satanic origin and that R.C. Christian belongs to the Luciferia Cabal, which joins the new world order. [2] At the unveiling of the monument, the local minister declared that he believed the monument was for sun worshippers, cult worship and devil worship. [5] Others have argued that the Rosicrucians ordered the stones[11] with the conspiracy theorist Jay Weidner and stated that the pseudonym of the man who ordered the stones – R.C. Christian – resembles the Rose Cross Christian, Christian Rosenkreuz, the founder of the Rosicrucian order. [2] Alex Jones' film Endgame: Blueprint for Global Enslavement suggests that joysticks are the oars of the world's elite who intend to destroy most of the world's population. [12] The most widely agreed interpretation of the stones is that they describe the basic concepts needed to rebuild a destroyed civilization. [2] Author Brad Meltzer notes that the stones were built in 1979 at the height of the Cold War and therefore claims that they were intended as a message to potential survivors of nuclear war. The engraved proposal to keep the population of mankind below 500 million could have been made on the assumption that the war had already reduced mankind below this number. [13] The guide stones were briefly shown and discussed in the 1986 documentary Sherman's March and were widely featured in a 2012 episode of Mysteries at the Museum, Monumental Mysteries Special featuring Don Wildman.
